


- Practice visual examination and pattern recognition skills in observation and discussion of quilts via Object Based Learning


Quilt 77-117-2, Pine Tree Pattern,
1880 Sarah Hamor







- PARENTS EXPRESSED CONCERN IF GROUP SIZES BECOME TOO LARGE


